Baptism Liturgy part 1.

The decision.

Parents and Godparents declare their faith in which they will bring up their children.

Harry and Archer answer for themselves.

These three questions will be asked.

Q? Do you turn to Jesus Christ?

Q? Do you repent of your sins?

Q? Do you turn from evil to the life Jesus gives

Afterwards everyone who is baptised is invited to re-affirm their baptismal promise.

Reading – John 11:17-27

(page 101 in the New Testament section of the bibles)

Talk 1. It's an odd day to talk about there being a time to die!

Origami. A challenge is set for the young people to follow.

Baptism Liturgy part 2.

Signed with the cross.

A short liturgy introduces this section where each candidate is signed with oil and is prayed for. These words are used.

Christ claims you for his own, receive the sign of the cross. Stand firm in the faith of Christ your Lord and Saviour.

Talk 2. Carpe Diem – seize the day.

Prayers.

Baptism Liturgy part 3.

Each candidate is baptised.

(We turn to face the font. Please make sure children can see, move around so that you can follow and take part in each baptism)

Leader – To enter God's kingdom you must be born again – born of water and the Spirit. Here is water for baptism.

All – Water can cleanse, heal, refresh, give life.

Leader – Father bless this water as it's used for baptism.

All – Bless Edward, Harry, Archer and Eva as they are baptised and fill them with your Holy Spirit.

Leader – Pour out upon these children your love and grace that they may walk as children of light.

All – May your Holy Spirit cleanse, heal, refresh and give life; that together we may walk as children of light.

I baptise you in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, Amen.

Leader – May God who has received you by baptism into His church, pour into your life His love and grace.

All – Live in the power of the cross, live in the light of truth, let the Holy Spirit guide your steps day by day.

A lighted candle is given and we process to the Front singing
