Currying Favour

Of all the things that might have occurred following our relocation from Nottingham to Sunningdale I didn't expect a personal epiphany. I can't recall now how the conversation began but it suddenly dawned on me that I had never eaten a curry.



As a child we never had curry at home and neither did my

wife's family. Once we married we didn't cook curry and didn't have it when out and about. Our friends didn't eat curry and I'm fairly sure we didn't live in some weird north-western backwater, it just wasn't part of their diet either.


Consequently whenever there's been a choice I haven't gone for a curry and it simply never occurred to me there was a culinary gap in my personal experience.

Of course there are lots of other experiences I haven't had. I know I've decided that bungy jumping is not for me. I think I'll pass on getting a tattoo. The only white powder I'm likely to indulge in is used to thicken a sauce when cooking. I know the things I've decided to avoid.

But I didn't consciously decide to avoid curry, it just happened. Step forward my own personal Passepartout* who decided to facilitate my journey into the unknown. Of course this particular Passepartout couldn't resist bringing along witnesses, all hoping to see something hilarious. I think he might have sold tickets.

I was introduced to this taste sensation with a gentle start and discovered a whole new world. The first occasion was fabulous and after a suitable gap, Passepartout planned phase 2, ramping up the choices and experiences. Oh my! What have I been missing all these years? What extraordinary foods that everyone else so casually consumes. I'm almost glad I've never eaten curry so as to have the experience of trying this for the first time among a gleeful band of brothers.

The curious thing was I hadn't been consciously avoiding it all these years, but simply a conglomeration of events and circumstances led to it not being in my experience up until now. Mulling it over one day I realized that faith (or church / religion / Christianity) bypasses plenty of people just as curry bypassed me. There are those who have tried it and decided it wasn't for them. There are those who tried it and the church let them down (sadly far too many of those. Google "Justin Welby/Apology/Survivors"). And then there are those who haven't tried it and it's never occurred to try it and you don't miss what you've never had.



Of course you can live without curry and you can carry on without faith, but just as one has enriched my life's experience, so the other can transform it. I admit, church can be really dull and church can spectacularly fail to care for those who come. But at Holy Trinity I see welcome, friendship, exuberance, love, care, joy, healing, and genuine worship. Through faith we explore the meaning of life, the universe and everything and our lives are the richer and more complete because of it.

I'm glad Passepartout invited me to explore a new experience and I, in turn, would like to extend the

invitation to anyone who tried church once, or used to go, or would like to discover what it's all about. You will be very very welcome.

There are some pictures on-line, but it occurred to me that members of the community might have taken photographs from various places and in various seasons, I would love to see them and if possible have a copy.

It was in my mind to make this request in this edition of the magazine, when a lovely gift was given to my by the daughters of Ronald Turner. Ron was the Verger at the church for 40 years and his father before him. The

family's association with Holy Trinity stretches back a very long way and Ron lies at rest in the grounds.

The photograph is of the interior of the church long before any of the changes we are so familiar with. It is fascinating and the more I look the more details I see.



In particular, the material hanging behind the Altar. I've been told that the tiles and ornate cross had all been covered over at one time so that some people didn't know any of that was there, but I never thought I would see what that

was like. Thanks to this thoughtful gift I can see the church from a bygone era. I shall frame the photograph and position it for the community to see. A small portion is reproduced at the bottom of this page. I am most grateful to have this.
