Children's Church at Home 13 December 2020

Isaiah 40:1-11 God's Straight Highway 'The voice of one crying out in the wilderness: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight.

Craft ingredients: card, wool or string, sellotape, pens, scissors, pipe cleaners, beads if you have any, a scrap of material or J cloth or similar!

First: getting ready. What do you need to do to get ready in the morning? Does it take long? What about getting ready for Christmas? That takes a while doesn't it? And there's a fair bit of waiting! Here's a story about some old people who did a lot of waiting, and what happened later. But first see what Isaiah the prophet said about it all, long, long before.

Story: Three readings! Start with Isaiah 40:1-11.

<u>Isaiah 40:3-5 ERV - Listen, there is someone shouting: - Bible Gateway</u>. Now a question. Can you tell whether these are boys names or girls names? Zechariah? Annas? Elizabeth? Gabriel? Listen out for them in the next part of the story, which happens not long before Jesus was born.

Luke 1: 1-25 and 57-80 <u>Luke 1:5-25 ERV - Zechariah and Elizabeth - During the - Bible Gateway</u> Well,, John grows up and things begin to get exciting.

Luke 3:2-18 ERV - Annas and Caiaphas were the high - Bible Gateway

Think: What did John tell people to do? What was he sure about? What did he do to help people understand that they could be forgiven and start a new life?

Craft: make a model of John.

Activity: two suggestions. John lived on locusts (like large grasshoppers) and honey from wild bees when he was in the wilderness. Try pretzels instead of locusts and dip them in honey. Yummy? Probably not ideal if that was all you had to eat and you had to get the honey yourself. The bees might not be too keen on sharing. Or use string or tape or tinsel to mark a straight line along the floor. Ask someone to turn you round 3 times and then try to walk along it without wobbling off. Easy? Try it blindfolded.
